



# TCPS SUMMER CAMP IS BACK!

We are ready to welcome back our students! Re-opening our doors is going to look a little different. New policies are in effect to minimize risks and keep everyone as safe as possible. Working with guidelines from the Ontario Government and local public health authorities, we have developed a plan to reopen safely. Your health and safety remain our top priority.

## New Safety Practices

Our extensive protocols and procedures are in place and staff are trained and ready to focus on your child's health and safety, so that they can enjoy summer camp and re-connect with friends.

**Some of the enhanced protocols will include the following:**

High touch areas will be disinfected regularly.

Classrooms and multi-use rooms will be cleaned and disinfected after each use.

Staff will be wearing masks when they are not able to social distance.

All staff and camp participants will be screened prior to entry.

Staff will ensure that safety protocols are followed.

Hand sanitizer stations will be located throughout the building.



## What to Expect

### Drop off and Pick Up

Arrive at the school and enter through the Main entrance doors.

Parents are asked to accompany their child to the check in / screening area upon arrival.

Our staff will ask your child a few questions and conduct a thermal temperature check.

Anyone showing signs or symptoms will not be permitted to enter the building.

Directional Signs will indicate physical distancing requirements.

When picking up please enter through the main entrance doors and proceed to the check in / screening area.

A staff member will call your child to the check in zone / screening area and release the child to the authorized pick-up person.





## The New Camp Structure

Campers will be assigned to “a cohort” that will have a maximum of 10 individuals which will include both staff and children.

Each cohort will stay together throughout the day and will not mix with other cohorts.

The cohort / class teacher will lead all the academic, sports, fun science, art, and computer classes.


The cohort / class teacher will be required to limit their movements between classes doing so only when absolutely necessary.

Physical distancing of 2 metres should be maintained between cohorts and where possible, between children within the same cohort.

Non-medical / cloth masks are strongly recommended when physical distancing cannot be maintained.

Masks do not replace the need for physical distancing, hand washing and staying home when sick.

Face coverings may not be tolerated by everyone.



## Classroom Materials

Campers will be provided with individualized bins / containers for their own class materials such as pencils, pencil crayons, supplies etc.

Classroom materials, designated materials, and equipment such as gym equipment will be disinfected after each use.

Cohorts will be provided with their own recess / gym equipment.

Campers should label their own water bottle and should refill the water bottles rather than drinking directly from the water fountain.

Campers must bring their own lunch and staff will reinforce “no food sharing policies.”

Personal belongings should be minimized, and campers will be provided with a locker.

## Cleaning and Disinfection

Common area and items, inside and outside the classrooms including high-touch surfaces will be cleaned and disinfected a minimum of twice daily and as often as necessary.

Public health awareness signs will be posted in visible locations to raise awareness about COVID-19 and to encourage healthy behaviours.
