If you have any questions or concerns, please don’t hesitate to contact the office.

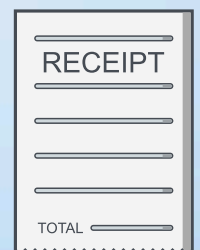
Grade 8 Grad Photo Day – Wednesday, February 4
